



## Adolescence Inclusive Generalist Education Program Continuation Information

**Plan of Study (POS)** The Adolescence Inclusive Generalist POS is an individualized contract to enroll in the four semester phases of the program. Your Plan of Study is based on the number of courses left in major, general education, generalist cognates, and professional courses. **You are not officially enrolled in the program or eligible to register for education classes requiring department approval until you complete the online orientation and schedule an advising appointment with the Coordinator of Undergraduate Education to sign the POS as indicated in the decision letter.** Each semester follow your plan of study when registering for courses.

**Pre-Professional Generalist Cognates** can be taken prior to program acceptance, may fulfill major and/or general education requirements, and must be completed prior to student teaching.

- English (2 courses): **ENL 112** or above
- Mathematics (2 courses): **MTH 111** or above
- Science (2 courses – at least one lab science): Choose from **AST 203, BIO 111, CHM 121, ESC 195, NAS 273, PHS 205** or above, **GEL 100, GEP 115**
- Social Studies (2 courses): One American History from **HST 110, 211 or 212** and one from **ANT, ECN, SOC 100** or above, **HST 130** (non-majors), **HST 201** or above, **PLS 111** or **ESC 102**

## **Registering for EDI Courses**

Some EDI courses require department approval using a Permission Key Number (PKN) to register on the Campus Information System. The advisement key number, obtained from your academic advisor, allows you to register for all classes. Student teaching registration is processed by the Field Experience Office. ## **Continued Eligibility**

- **Maintain  $\geq 2.5$  Cumulative Brockport GPA.** If your cumulative Brockport GPA drops below a 2.5 while enrolled in the program, you will be placed on Academic Probation for one semester. During the probationary semester, you cannot register or remain registered for EDI courses (except EDI 413). You must take non-EDI courses to raise the cumulative GPA to 2.5. If you are unable to raise the GPA at the end of the probationary semester, you will no longer be eligible to continue in the program.
- **Earn  $\geq C+$  in EDI Professional Courses.** If you earn a grade less than a C+ in any EDI course, you will be placed on Academic Probation and must repeat the EDI course(s) during the probationary semester. You will not be able to register for the next phase of education courses until you successfully repeat the EDI course(s) during the probationary semester.
- **PSH 484, PRO 370, Foreign Lang 112 level require  $\geq C$ .** These courses must be successfully repeated prior to student teaching if you earn less than a C.

## **Course Substitution Information**

EDI 430 covers general education codes I, W, Y, if completed at Brockport. An online course does not satisfy the Y code. Approval required for transfer courses unless listed under the community college transfer advising guides on the EHD department website. Submit course description and syllabus to Undergraduate Coordinator.

## **Field Experience/Student Teaching Information**

The department strongly encourages completion of all degree requirements, including major/minor courses prior to student teaching. All Generalist Cognates and Professional Phase courses listed on page 1 must be completed prior to student teaching with the exception of PRO 370, foreign language, and EDI 430. The department strongly recommends you do not take any courses during the 12-credit Student Teaching semester.

### **Doubling Up on Field Placements**

In the fall semester the Department reviews requests from teacher candidates citing extenuating circumstances to combine the remaining two 50-hour field placement courses: EDI 465-469 and EDI 414 in the upcoming spring semester. Candidates must be enrolled in EDI 445-449 in the fall semester, in good academic standing, particularly in education courses, and submit a written request clearly expressing your particular situation. All candidates enrolled in EDI 445-449 in the fall semester who have not completed EDI 414 will receive an email notification of the process around November 1 from the Field Experience Office. Requests are reviewed by a department committee and candidates are notified by the third Monday in November. Requests are reviewed only in the fall semester, apply to candidates who have not completed EDI 414 and cite extenuating circumstances for completing the remaining two 50-hour field placement courses in the upcoming spring semester.

## **Certification Information**

Certification Workshops - If you transferred a course for EDI 413 or PRO 370 and lack Autism Training (EDI 413) or the Child Abuse and School Violence Prevention seminars (PRO 370), local providers are posted on the certification website listed below. The seminars are a NYSED certification requirement. The new Harassment and Bullying Prevention Training (DASA) is a graduation requirement.

A presentation on certification requirements including workshops and state exams is given every semester in EDI 414 Methods of Special Education classes by the Coordinator of Certification. EAS - Educating All Students	After taking EDI 413, 414, 419, and 430
CST-MST-Content Specialty Test_Multi-Subject Test (7-12)	After completing 6 credits in English, History, Science, Mathematics, and required Foreign Language and Fine Arts Courses. It is recommended that you take Math courses up to the level of Pre-Calculus since Pre-Calculus is included in the Multi-Subject Test.
CST - Content Specialty Test <b>**Literacy B-12 Students</b> must take the CST - Literacy exam	After completing all courses within the discipline major.
CST-SWD - Content Specialty Test - Students with Disabilities	After completing EDI 413, 414, and 419
EdTPA - Education Teacher Performance Assessment	During student teaching
