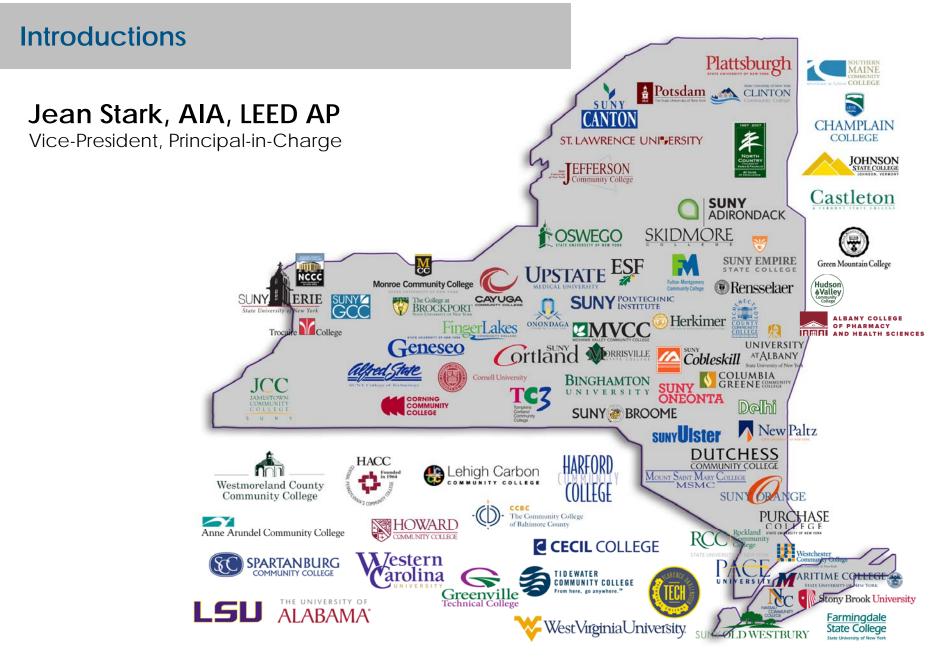

Larger classrooms needed to accommodate increasing section sizes (in right-sized spaces)

Convert underutilized teaching labs to create in-demand labs

Access to additional computer classrooms was requested

Office space needed by some departments; inappropriately assigned in other areas

Informal gathering/collaborative space is needed

Additional meeting and storage space is desired

Accessibility improvements needed campus-wide

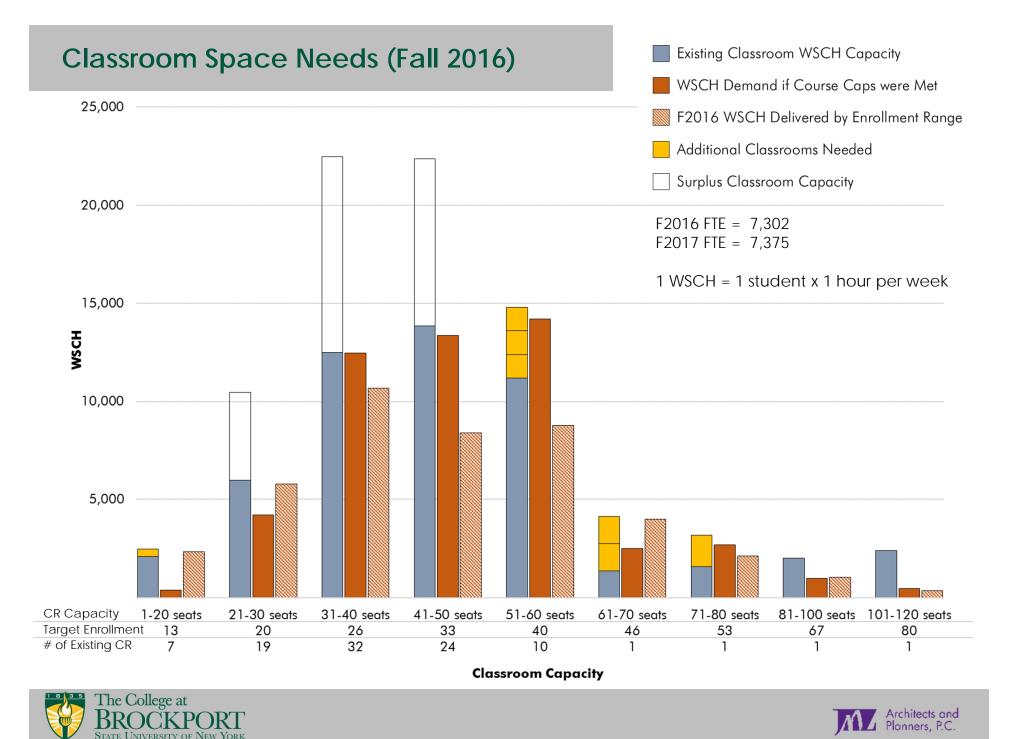

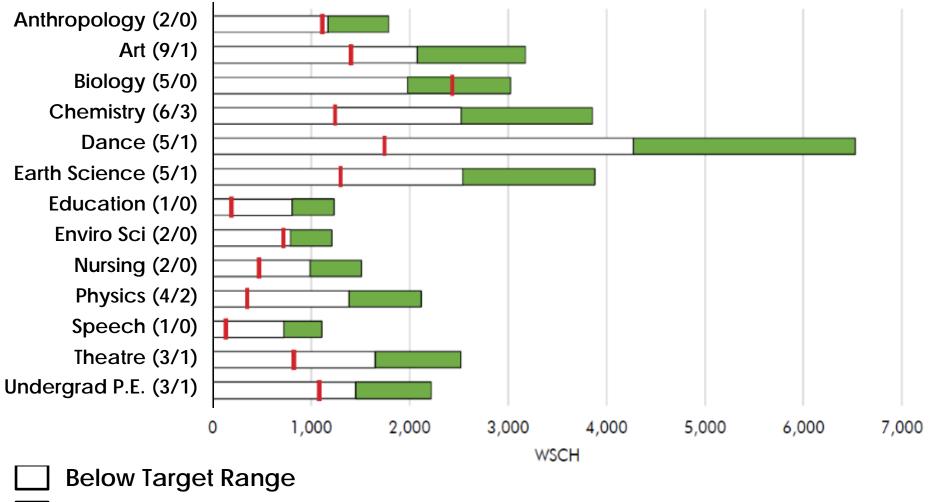








## Teaching Lab Space Needs (Fall 2016)



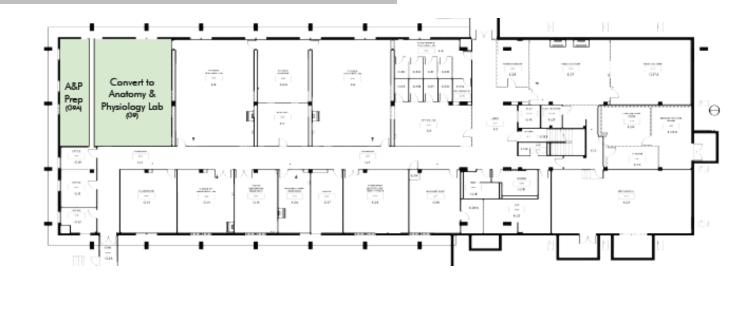

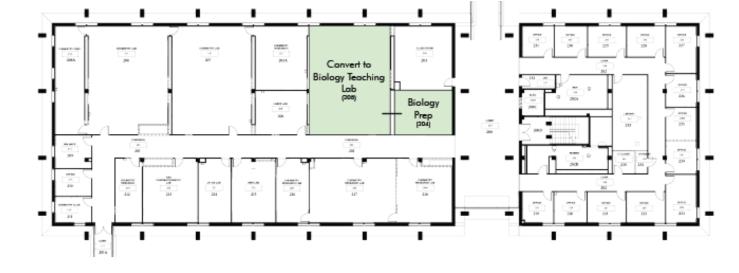

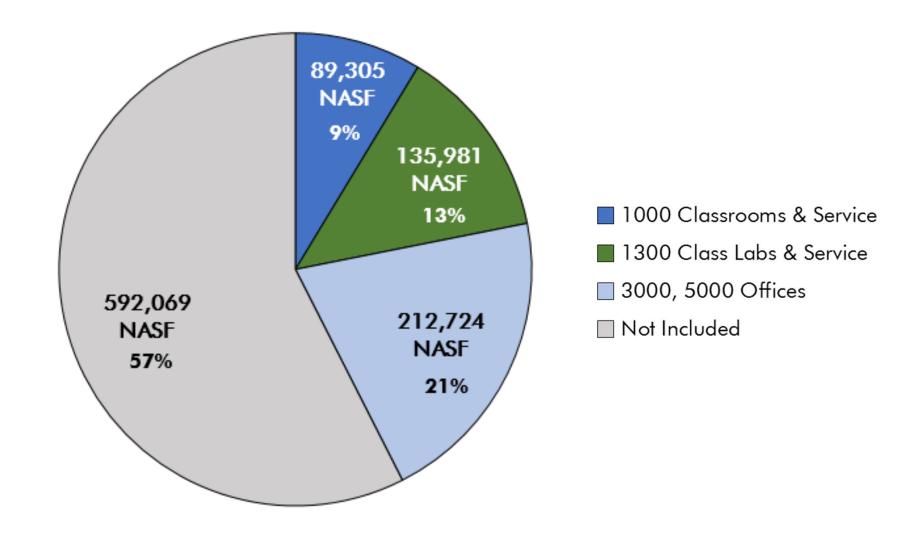

## Total Campus NASF included in the Study

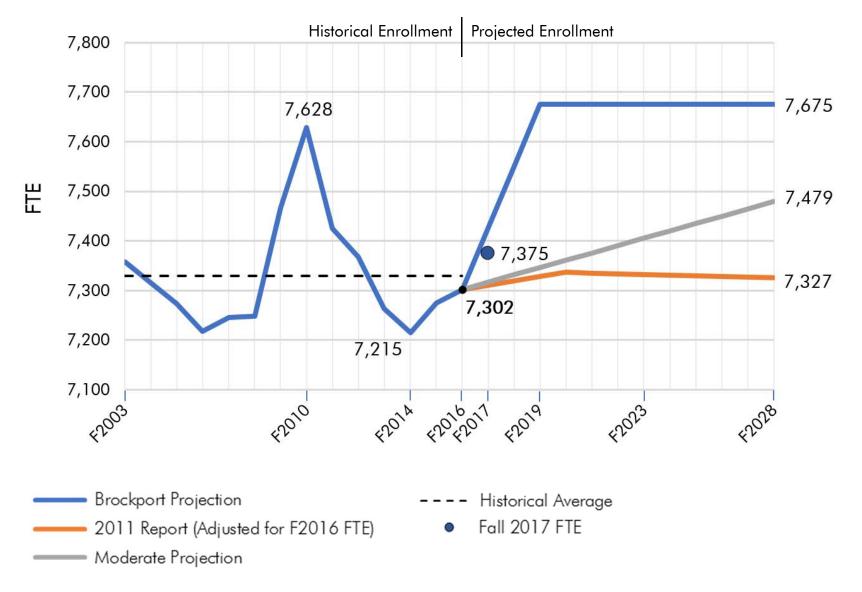

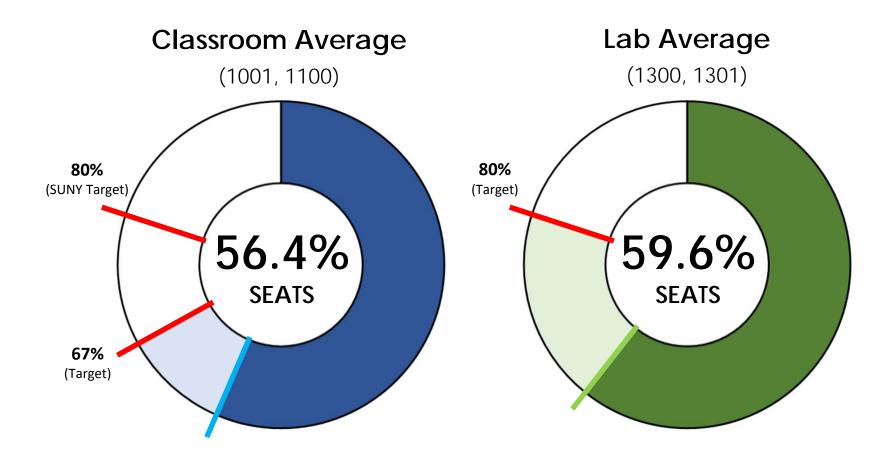

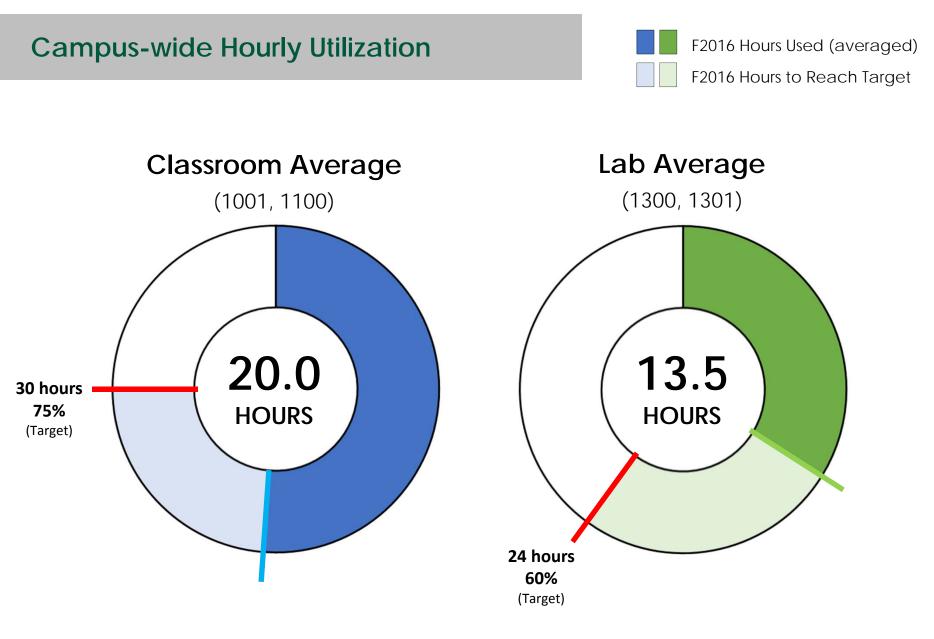

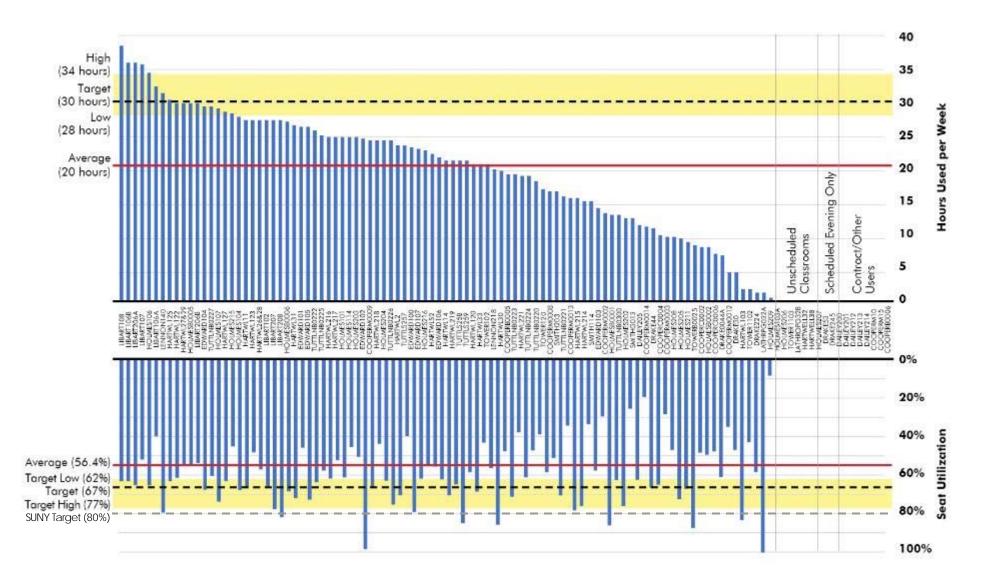

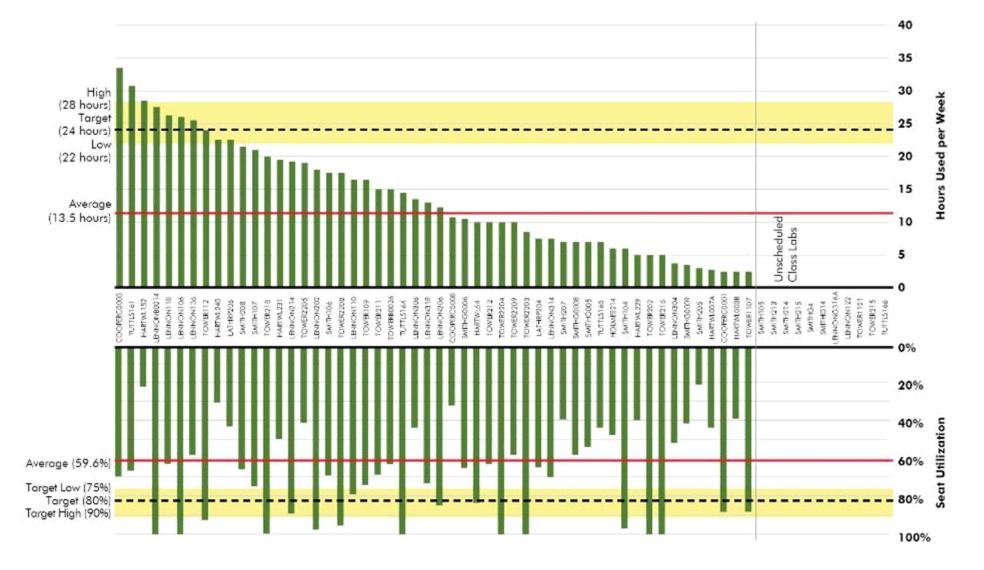
## **Classroom Utilization**







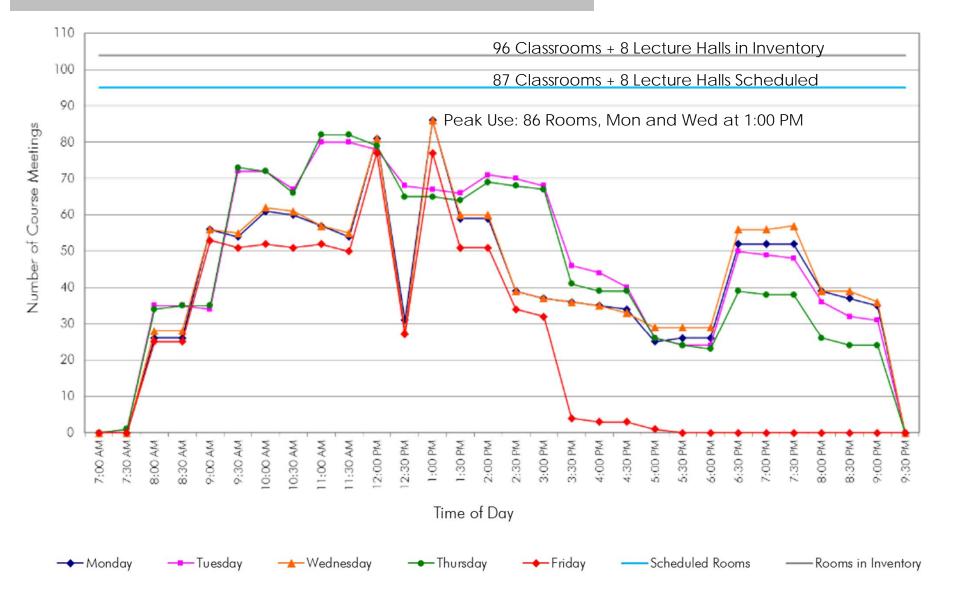
## **Class Lab Utilization**







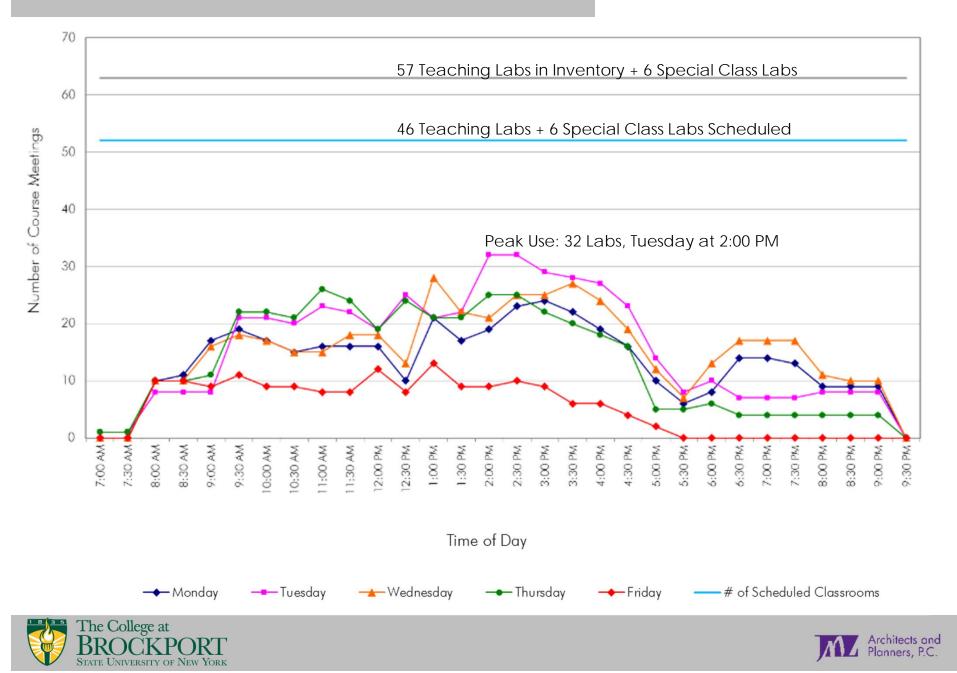
## **Classroom Meetings by Time of Day**

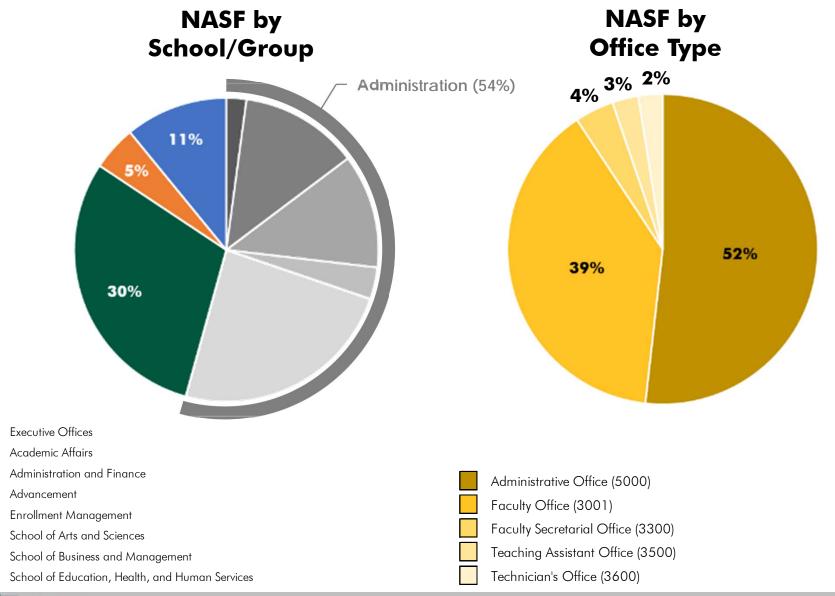

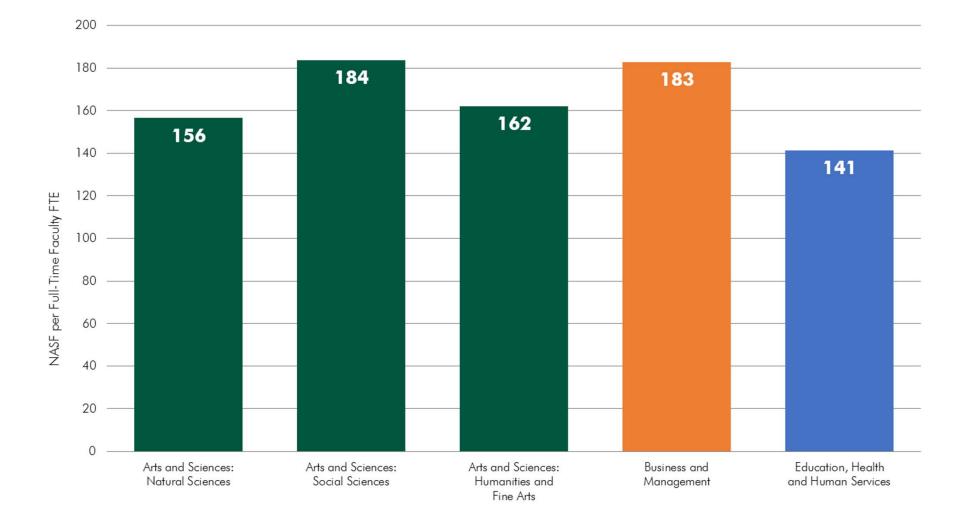
