INTERNAL GRANTS

Scholarly Incentive, Pre-Tenure, and Post-Tenure Awards

Applications due: November 1, 2021 or February 7, 2022.

Scholarly Incentive Award

This competitive, merit-based award is designed to help full-time tenure tract, and three-year QAR faculty advance scholarly production in their home disciplines. Funding may be used to conduct research or creative projects valued by their home department's APT documents as fulfilling scholarship requirements for tenure and/or promotion.

Pre-Tenure Grants Development Award

This a competitive, merit-based award for pre-tenure faculty to pursue scholarly activity. Funding may be used to conduct research or creative projects valued by their home departments' APT documents as fulfilling scholarship requirements for tenure and/or promotion.

Provost's Post-Tenure Fellowship

This competitive, merit-based fellowship enables tenured faculty to cover expenses associated with substantial scholarly endeavors in their home disciplines.

Distinguished Professor Award for Graduate Students

Applications due: October 11, 2021 or February 11, 2022

This competitive, one-time award up to \$1,000 is awarded to matriculated and enrolled graduate students to support eligible expenses associated with a program-required research project or creative activity.

Faculty/Staff Technology Grant

Applications due: February 11, 2022

This technology support initiative exists to identify and support the needs of individual (or small groups of) faculty and staff for job-related technology support.

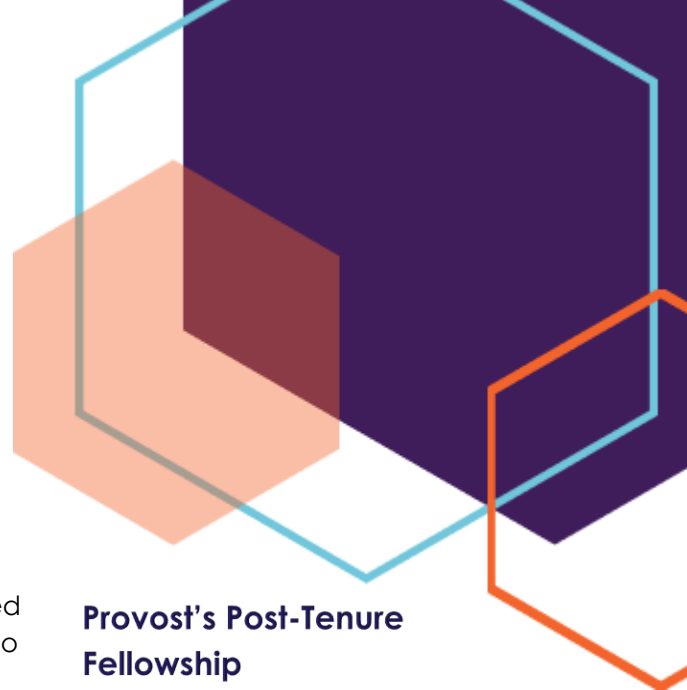
IRB Updates

Student Travel Grant Awards are available to part and full time undergraduate and graduate students at the college to attend, or present at, conferences. The maximum amount allotted is \$300 per student per year (which can now be split between two conferences). The conferences can be local, regional, national, or international. The conference can be virtual or in-person.

Applications are due: **November 1, 2021** and **February 15, 2022**.

We would like to highlight a few of the conferences that our students attended during the 2020-2021 academic year...

Undergraduate student, Molly French, who is majoring in Psychology, virtually presented at the Eastern Psychological Association's annual meeting. Of the meeting, Molly said "I was able to practice connecting my research to past research and explaining how it is relevant to the field of psychology today."

Aaron Heisey, a Graduate student majoring in Environmental Science and Ecology, virtually presented at the American Fisheries Society's annual meeting. Aaron said of the experience, "The conference enabled me to present my findings on this [juvenile lake trout and the role of thiamine] research as well as engage in professional development activities."
